Where necessary, remove weld spatter and smooth weld seams and sharp edges. Clean welds and damaged shop-primer by grit-blasting to Sa2 (ISO 8501-1:2007) or by power tooling to Pt3 (JSRA SPSS :1984) or St3 (ISO 8501-1:2007).

As an undercoat/tie coat

The primer surface should be clean, dry and free from all contamination. Areas of breakdown, damage etc. should be prepared to the specified standard (eg. Sa2½ (ISO 8501-1:2007)). Intergard 276 must be applied within the overcoated intervals specified (consult the relevant product data sheet)

To avoid pin-holing over inorganic zinc silicate primers, Intergard 276 should be thinned by 15-25% with International GTA220.
